## Breen pushes for more Euro rounds

Craig Breen could expand his ERC schedule to include next month's trip to the Canary Islands.

Breen began his eightevent European campaign in a Peugeot Sport-backed 207 S2000 with second place on Rally Liepaja-Ventspils in Latvia at the weekend. The 23-year-old led after winning the opening five stages.

His next scheduled event is Rallye Azores in April but Breen is now trying to secure funding to compete in Gran Canaria as well. "It would be nice to do it and we will work hard to put something together and go to the Canaries, that's the next one on the cards," Breen told Motorsport News. "I'd like to be there and we'll see if we can make it work."

Breen's French Saintéloc Racing team is scheduled to run Corsican Jean-Mathieu Leandri on the Tarmac round and adding a second 207 could reduce the amount of money Breen needs to find.

In terms of his title



challenge, Breen's second place and leg-by-leg bonus points puts him in fifth place in the table. "We're starting the season with a good points haul from the first round. It was an unfamiliar rally and probably a surface that doesn't suit me like the Tarmac does," said Breen, who is being codriven by David Moynihan.
